

Om Hassan enrolled Fatma her small daughter in the Abassa village (Qous District), preschool class, saying that she also attended the class not only to become familiar with the three basic “Rs” but also to help her daughter with homework.

Om Malak Saad Al-Din also said
“I feel proud of my little Malak”
who joined the preschool class in Gezeret Mottera (Qous District) given Malak has learned excellent behaviors and habits, namely washing hands before meals, throwing trash in the wastebasket and saying “In the name of Allah” before meals”.
She added that Malak has influenced the behavior of the family members who now have adopted these habits.

The village Saaeda lives in has only one primary school and no institute for secondary education or vocational training.
Hope came when ENID/EI Nidaa partnered with a local NGO to provide literacy and skill training for drop-out girls in their village of el Makhzan, (Qous District).
She enrolled in the literacy class for 9 months with 24 girls.
After passing the government literacy exam, they are now enrolled in a vocational training course and learning how to sew garments.

Saaeda says
***“The course will enable me to produce and sell.
And I think that great things will happen in my life now.
I hope to continue working with the local NGO to help increase my experience and train more in marketing. If I cannot work with the NGO, I will buy a machine and start to work by myself at home.”***

In Gezeret Mottera, (Qous District), three batches of TVET students have graduated from ENID/EI Nidaa’s special ToT training classes for the forthcoming readymade garments factory in Zaheer Sahrawi.

Fatma Hussein Amin, who was awarded a diploma in commerce, says that she had little information about sewing prior to joining the sewing workshop.
She confirms that her skills have been further enhanced and developed after joining the sewing workshop, saying

“ I now have the ability to design, cut patterns and produce items such as bedcovers”.

Fatma, like other select TVET graduates, is expected to teach her skills to members of the female workforce once the RMG factory commences activities.
